For students, the Sustainability Internship Programme will be carried out in two runs per year, for 12 weeks. The Sustainability Professional Programme will cater for those with at least two years of work experience and want to upgrade their skills or switch careers. Both efforts will start in the second half of this year. Companies such as Singtel and Sembcorp Industries have agreed to offer internship places and GCNS is in talks with other companies.
