According to the <u>United Nations Environment Programme</u>, clean energy is defined as power created using renewable resources such as the wind, water and the sun. Clean energy sources generate little to no pollution or emissions, compared to traditional fossil fuels such as oil and coal. The concept of clean energy also involves energy efficiency.

In 2015, <u>Apple Singapore</u> has announced that it will power all of its Singapore operations with renewable energy, particularly through <u>solar panels</u> on the rooftops of more than 800 Housing Board buildings across the island.

As a highly urbanised city-state with limited natural resources, sustainability is synonymous with Singapore. The city-state places sustainability at the core of its government policies over the decades while enabling a growing economy. One of the main drivers of this clean energy initiative is the <u>Singapore Economic Development Board</u> (EDB).

#### **HULT PRIZE 2018**



The inaugural Hult Prize at NTU will be held on 13 December 2017.

Dubbed the world's largest student competition for the creation of new social businesses, the annual Hult Prize awards start-up funding for radical and breakthrough ideas that solve the world's toughest social challenges.

The 2018 Hult Prize will focus on  $\ensuremath{\mathbf{HARNESSING\ THE\ POWER\ OF\ ENERGY.}}$ 

The Challenge: Can you build a scalable, sustainable social enterprise that harness the power of energy to transform the lives of 10 million people by 2025?

The winner of the NTU finals will automatically advance to compete in one of 15 regional finals happening around the world in March 2018. One winning team from each host city will then move onto a summer business incubator for 8 weeks, where participants will receive mentorship, advisory and strategic planning as they create prototypes and set-up to launch their new social business. A final round of competition will be hosted in September 2018, where the winning team will be awarded the US\$1 million prize.
