Welcome to the Office of Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

Across most developed nations, landfill still remains the primary means of waste disposal. Many countries are attempting to minimise the amount of waste going to incinerators and landfill sites by developing recycling programs.

According to official figures in 2015 by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), Germany (65%) topped the charts as the most efficient country in recycling and composting. Coming in a close second is South Korea (59%). The least efficient are Turkey (1%) and New Zealand (0%).

The Germans take their recycling agenda very seriously. There are at least five types of rubbish bins in the courtyards of apartment buildings and inside people's houses. The bins are colour-coded for different materials and to avoid any confusion. For "special rubbish" such as batteries or chemicals, the Germans are obliged to bring it to a recycling centre. If they fail to do this, it could be considered an "administrative offence".

So where do Singapore line up on these charts? A growing population and rising affluence led to a rebound in the total amount of waste generated by the Republic, even as the recycling rate saw an uptick. According to the National Environment Agency (NEA), Singapore disposed 8,560 tonnes of rubbish a day (equivalent to the weight of 1,427 adult elephants) in 2016! Together with other types of waste such as metals and construction debris, we are sending about 200,000 tonnes of solid waste and all incineration ash yearly to the Semakau Landfill. If this rate continues and nothing is done to weaken its progress, the landfill will <u>run out of space by around 2035</u>.

No experience is required. Participants will need to bring their own laptop and mouse.


