Welcome to the Office of Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

International Volunteer Day is celebrated worldwide on 5 December each year. It allows volunteers and organisations to share values and promote their work among communities, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), government authorities and the private sector.

In recent years, there has been a huge push by the government and the voluntary sector to encourage youth volunteering. According to <u>The National Council for Voluntary Organisations</u> (NCVO) in United Kingdom, rates of volunteering among 16-25 year olds <u>rose by 50%</u> between 2010 and 2015.

In Singapore, the Individual Giving Survey 2016 by the National Volunteer and Philanthropy Centre (NVPC) showed that 41% of youth between 15-24 year olds have volunteered (excluding the compulsory community service in school) at least once in the last 12 months.

The high volunteerism rate among youths may be explained in the context of three main areas – namely volunteering gives them a sense of identity, purpose and belonging. Youths want to be affirmed that what they do matter and in turn receive some acknowledgement for their contribution. Next, when youths understand the communities they serve, good work will eventually be done. Lastly, youths tend to also volunteer with friends or even to make friends, and this strengthens their social hond.
