Do you have a passion for seniors and youths?

<u>Calvary Community Care</u> (C3) is a not-for-profit Voluntary Welfare Organisation that seeks to serve the needy in the community regardless of race, age, gender or religion. They are recruiting student volunteers for each of their programmes:

## 1. Befriending (Seniors)

Volunteers will be paired and assigned a senior to be friend through regular home visits (1-2 hours once in 1-2 weeks). Minimum commitment is 8 months or more.

### 2. OTAGO Exercise Programme (Seniors)

Volunteers will help in the facilitation of the OTAGO Exercise Programme of the seniors (From January 2018: Every Tuesday or/and Thursday, 9.00 am - 2.00 pm)

OTAGO aims to increase the reach of evidence based practice to older people, providing small group exercise options to prevent falls, injuries and improve cognition amongst older people.

Minimum commitment is 6 months or more.

## 3. Youth Mentoring

Volunteers will conduct activities for the youths (13-16 years old), befriend and provide academic coaching at its centres. Minimum commitment is one fixed day/week for 6 months or more.
