PLASTICS. We use them in our daily lives – grocery shopping, throwing out the trash, food take-outs – and they seem to be indispensable.

According to <u>Plastics Ocean Foundation</u>, the world is now producing nearly 300 million tons of plastic every year, half of which is for single use. More than 8 million tons of plastic is dumped into the oceans every year.

In July 2017, China has announced that it will <u>ban imports of 24 categories of recyclables (plastic, textiles and mixed paper) and solid waste from 1 January 2018.</u>
Theresa May, Britain's Prime Minister, <u>pledged to eliminate avoidable plastic waste by 2042</u> – the government wants supermarkets to introduce "plastic-free aisles" and charge customers who take plastic bags.

Here in Singapore, Zero Waste SG, started the Bring Your Own (BYO) Singapore campaign for retailers to offer incentives to customers who bring their own bags, bottles or containers
