Semakau Landfill, located approximately 8 km south of Singapore, is the world's first-of-its-kind offshore landfill and the only landfill in Singapore for waste disposal.

About 180,000 tonnes of non-recyclable waste go directly to Pulau Semakau each year. However, the landfill is expected to be filled in 2045 despite efforts made to extend its lifespan.

These games are organised by Society Staples, a social enterprise that raises awareness of Persons With Disabilities (PWDs) through sports themed workshops and community events.
