# Welcome to the Office of Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

The theme for Singapore Budget 2018 is "Together, A Better Future". Laying the foundation for Singapore's development into the next decade, the Budget took in consideration three major shifts: a shift in global economic weight towards Asia; the emergence of new technologies; and Singapore's ageing population.

In this issue, we explore two strategies that help to address the three shifts.

- 1. <u>Building a Smart, Green and Liveable city</u>: Starting from 2019 to 2023, a <u>carbon tax</u> of \$5 per tonne of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions will be introduced for all facilities producing 25,000 tonnes or more of GHG emissions in a year. Funds will also be set aside to enhance support for companies to improve energy efficiency.
- 2. <u>A Caring and Cohesive Society</u>: The <u>Community Networks for Seniors</u>, which encourages active ageing and helps lonely seniors find new friends, will go national by 2020. The <u>Community Silver Trust</u> (a fund which provides dollar-for-dollar matching for donations to volunteer organisations providing long-term care services) and the <u>Seniors' Mobility and Enabling Fund</u> will be topped up. Tax deductions for donations to <u>Institutions of a Public Character</u> will also be extended, in order to encourage a spirit of giving.

### 15 SHORTS

15 Shorts is a landmark film project by local film company Blue3Asia, the National Volunteer & Philanthropy Centre (NVPC) and 15 Singaporean filmmakers to support the SG Cares movement. Notable filmmakers include Eric Khoo, Kelvin Tong, Boo Junfeng and Daniel Yam.

The 15 Shorts film project showcases lesser-told stories of everyday Singaporean heroes in the 1970s to 1990s with the aim to inspire acts of giving. The films aim to raise awareness on critical and emergent social issues such as social isolation faced by the elderly, support of learning disabilities and autism, as well as fair treatment of migrant workers.

The first five films have been released on a dedicated microsite, <a href="www.15shorts.com">www.15shorts.com</a>. The films are also available on various broadcast platforms such as Mediacorp's free-to-air channel, <a href="Channel 5">Channel 5</a>, and online interactive service, <a href="Toggle">Toggle</a> from February to March. The remaining films are targeted for release in phases till end 2019.

Student Community Engagement aims to empower students to make a difference through positive social actions. We provide students access to opportunities such as grants for their ground-up initiatives and social entrepreneurship efforts, internships at non-profit organisations, and training programmes to develop community leadership skills.

We believe that young people have a critical role to play in building a better world for themselves and the community.
