Autism is a lifelong developmental disability that affects a person's ability to make sense of the world and relate with others. Revealed in the Government's third Enabling Masterplan, one in 150 children in Singapore has autism – a higher rate than the World Health Organisation's global figure of one in 160 children. No two persons with autism are the same and the Autism Network Singapore (ANS) was formed in 2015 to serve the community in areas like early intervention, lifelong education and job placement.

On 2 April, landmarks, buildings, homes and communities around the world will #LightItUpBlue to support the cause. Come to school in blue or check out ANS' Facebook page to find out more about other activities.
