"Towards a zero-waste nation" is listed as one of the five broad areas under the <u>Sustainable Blueprint 2015</u>, which contains a series of environmental goals to be met by 2030. To address the issue of waste, the <u>recycling goal is to hit a national rate of 70%</u>.

Singapore's National Recycling Programme was launched in 2001 to carry out fortnightly collections of recyclables. Since 2014, all new public housing developments launched have been fitted with dual chutes for refuse and recyclables. Public waste collectors also carry out Cash For Trash collections where residents can exchange recyclable items for cash.

The National Environment Agency reported that Singapore generated 7.7 million tonnes of solid waste in 2017, down from 7.81 million tonnes in 2016. However, the overall recycling rate remained at 61%.
