President Halimah Yacob delivered her <u>inaugural opening address</u> of Parliament on 7 May, mapping out the Government's priorities for the rest of its term. She outlined five key priorities in her speech:

- 3. Developing a vibrant economy with more opportunities for workers
- 4. Forging a cohesive, caring and inclusive society

She spoke of a new generation of Singaporeans coming of age – you – with your dreams, hope and fears in times like this, and called for 4G leaders to respond to the challenges of your time. In response, the call is also for young Singaporeans to take on responsibilities, and participate in building and guiding Singapore. This update focuses on forging a caring society.

An initiative has been launched with the aim of integrating special needs children into a mainstream school setting. Under this new initiative, special needs children in the Early Intervention Programme for Infants and Children (Eipic) centres are taught by professionals trained in early intervention alongside their pre-school teachers. The Eipic professionals also advise mainstream pre-school teachers, who may not have had training on how to handle such children. Read more...
