Welcome to the Office of Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

The United Nations has designated this past Wednesday (27 June) as Micro-, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs) Day. These enterprises, which generally employ fewer than 250 persons, are the backbone of most economies worldwide and play a key role in developing countries. They are identified as a major driver of poverty alleviation and development.

Although MSMEs generate the most jobs, they face new challenges in day-to-day operations and growth. Access to finance is often cited as one of the primary obstacles and both policy makers and the private sector are encouraged to intervene, including provide access to affordable microfinance and credit.

According to the <u>Singapore Centre for Social Enterprise</u> (raiSE), the local social enterprise sector <u>grew by 32% in 2017, with 401 registered social enterprises — up from 303 enterprises in 2016</u>. Doing good is at the core of the business of a social enterprise and not just something that happens along the way. For a social enterprise, growth is a means to greater impact.
