VOLUNTEER CHILDMINDERS NEEDED You can help too!

DAUGHTERS OF TOMORROW CHILDMINDERS

<u>Daughters Of Tomorrow</u> (DOT) is a charity that facilitates livelihood opportunities for underprivileged women and supports them in building and sustaining financially independent and resilient families. Some of their female clients are often unable to find affordable childcare services while they attend training programmes at DOT. Hence, childminders are crucial to these women being able to better themselves without worrying their children or the additional costs of childcare.

Childminder volunteers will attend an orientation session (details to be confirmed), plan and execute activities to carry out with the children while their mothers are undergoing training. Once childminders are recruited, they will be teamed up and tasked to create a proposal detailing the activities to be carried out over the following weeks. The proposal will be vetted by DOT before volunteers get the green light to carry out the activities.

Volunteers are **required to commit at least for 6 to 9 weeks and within a full set of dates (ie. Set 1 or Set 2)**, so as to ensure familiarity between the children that you will be looking after, and volunteers that you will work with. However, alternative arrangements can be made on a case-to-case basis.
