According to the World Federation of the Deaf, there are approximately 72 million deaf people worldwide and more than 80% of them live in developing countries.

The International Day of Sign Languages (IDSL) is celebrated annually on 23 September, as part of the International Week of the Deaf (IWDeaf) which aims to raise awareness about the Deaf Community. The theme for ISDL 2018 is "With Sign Language, Everyone is Included!"

Similar to the 'Singlish' language that is unique to Singapore, the Deaf community here also has a Singapore Sign Language (SgSL). In NTU, we have the NTU Welfare Services Club Regular Service Project (Deaf Community) (WSC RSP DC) which champions the Deaf agenda. There are currently 155 NTU students trained in SgSL and some of them are even proficient enough to be SL interpreters! Not only do they spend weekends providing support to the Deaf community through various programmes, they also provide interpretation at some of our NTU events and even song-sign during Christmas!

The next time you spot a WSC RSP DC volunteer, do reach out and encourage them to keep up the good work!
