# Welcome to Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

World Mental Health Day is celebrated on 10 October every year, with the overall objective of raising awareness of mental health issues around the world and mobilising efforts in support of mental health. This day provides an opportunity for all stakeholders working on mental health issues to talk about their work and what more needs to be done in order to make mental health care a reality for people worldwide.

A Quality of Life Study by National Council of Social Service revealed that persons with mental health conditions have a significantly lower quality of life than the general population. Co-created with persons in recovery, a nationwide movement #BeyondTheLabel was launched and it aims to address stigma faced by persons with mental health conditions, and promote the acceptance and inclusion of persons in recovery in society. Seven in 10 persons with mental health conditions face challenges living with dignity because of the negative attitudes and actions of others.

The NTU Welfare Services Club Regular Service Project Mental Health is championing the agenda to help NTU students gain a better understanding of mental health through information workshops and interaction with beneficiaries.

Mental illness does not discriminate, so why should we? Let's unite against mental health stigma.
