Wasting less, eating better and adopting a sustainable lifestyle are key to building a world free of hunger. The choices we make today are vital for a secure future of food

According to the National Environment Agency, Singapore generated 809,800 tonnes of food waste in 2017 and this is equivalent to more than 54,000 double-decker buses! There is a need to manage food waste on a whole – reduce food wastage, redistribute unsold or excess food, and recycle/treat food waste – as we work towards becoming a Zero Waste Nation under the Sustainable Singapore Blueprint 2015.

You can also help to reduce food waste here in NTU! Just bring your non-perishable food items that are unopened, unused and with at least four weeks of shelf life to any of the four Food Bank bins around campus. There will also be initiatives by Earthlink NTU to collect these food items from residential halls – stay tuned for more updates on their Facebook page.

Each year, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) celebrates World Food Day on 16 October to commemorate the founding of the Organization in 1945. Events are organised worldwide to promote awareness and action for those who suffer from hunger and for the need to ensure food security and nutritious diets for all. World Food Day is also an important opportunity to send a strong message to the public: we can end hunger in this lifetime and become the #ZeroHunger Generation, but everyone needs to work together to achieve this goal.
