In this globalised nation, youths are increasingly exposed to other perspectives and conversations on current affairs and a wide range of issues. According to the National Youth Survey 2017 conducted by National Youth Council, 90% of youths regard helping the less fortunate and contributing to society as important life goals.

In the wake of honouring exceptional young people who excelled in their fields of pursuit and demonstrated a strong passion to make a difference in the community, the nation's highest accolade for youths, Singapore Youth Award was recently presented to six individuals. They include Daniel Teh, owner of Pope Jai Thai, a social enterprise restaurant whose workforce consists of mainly youths-at-risk and people with special needs, physical disabilities and mental health issues, and Jean Loo, co-founder of Superhero Me, a movement that harnesses the creative arts to empower children from less privileged and special needs communities.

Elsewhere in the world earlier this month, more than 2500 young people from 36 different countries gathered to showcase their entrepreneurial actions and social innovations. The Enactus World Cup is an opportunity for National Champion Enactus teams to share their journey on a global stage on how they are transforming lives to create a better future. Our very own Enactus NTU represented Singapore and was ranked third in its competition league, emerging within the top 18 teams. Watch their amazing presentation here. This annual gathering of passionate young individuals is a clear demonstration that despite the diversity of culture and experiences growing up, there is this shared purpose of wanting to make a difference to address important issues affecting the world.

Ex-problem kid driven to help at-risk youth

Youth worker Kevin Chia, 33, did not have the easiest time growing up. His dad was in and out of jail, while his mother struggled to provide for him and his brother. When his father was diagnosed with cancer, Kevin quit school to work to repay the debts accumulated from the medical treatment. Yet, he was determined to live his life the best way he could, and is today helping other at-risk youth. Read more...

Nigel Ng, 24, was diagnosed with selective mutism when he was nine. It is a form of anxiety disorder that meant he was not able to speak with certain people or in certain situations. After much therapy at Institute of Mental Health, Nigel has since rediscovered his voice and is starting the first support group here for people with selective mutism. In the longer term, he hopes to set up a social enterprise to help those with the condition. Read more...

After the loss of his grandfather to lung cancer in 2015, Aloysius Moh, 19, wanted to find a way to help people with chronic illnesses. Aloysius rallied his friends to start a campaign to raise awareness of bone marrow diseases. Within two days, the campaign recruited 234 bone marrow donors. Aloysius was awarded the National Youth Achievement Award (NYAA) gold award to recognise his efforts. Read more...

Crystal Goh, 32, had planned to go into music full-time, until she lost her voice to a rare neurological condition. But she has found another voice on behalf of vulnerable young people, helping them turn their life stories into music. Together with two friends, Crystal started Diamond on the Street, a social enterprise that allow young people to explore their life experiences and relationships through songwriting and storytelling programmes.
