# Welcome to Student Community Engagement's fortnightly update.

Migrant workers are special – they build our homes and they're part of our community but still largely unseen. Unlike lower-income Singaporeans who have safeguards such as government assistance programmes, family service centres, etc, migrant workers are especially vulnerable because they are unlikely to raise grievances and arrive here in debt.

According to the Ministry of Manpower, there are about 1.37 million migrant workers in Singapore as of June 2018. The lure of a better paying job in a wealthy country is a powerful driver of international migration. The attraction has intensified as income differentials among countries continue to grow.

18 December has been designated by the United Nations as International Migrants Day. You may want to approach a migrant worker on the street and wish them well in support of the #YellowHelmetChallenge, or even visit Migrant Workers' Centre or Transient Workers Count Too Facebook pages to see if there are activities that you can show your support. Let us continue to appreciate our migrant workers.

From factory worker poets to libraries for foreign domestic helpers, a new festival this weekend aims to draw links among migration, labour and art around the world. The first-ever <u>Global Migrant Festival</u> provides a platform for broader, critical, human-centric perspectives and dialogues on migration, in context of often vitriolic narratives that have dominated discussions on migration in Asia and across the world.

Catch an array of cultural performances, talks, films and panel discussions involving artists, economic migrants, refugees, academic experts and community advocates from non-profit organisations. The festival, which is intended to be biennial, also coincides with the finals of the annual Migrant Worker Poetry Competition (Singapore), now in its fifth year.

## **#YELLOWHELMETCHALLENGE**

The #YellowHelmetChallenge is a campaign by Labour Arty to foster friendships between Singaporeans and migrant workers. By taking an Augmented-Reality (AR) self-portrait while wearing a yellow safety helmet — we encourage locals to strike up a conversation with foreign construction workers, who constitute part of the 1.4 million total foreign workforce in Singapore.

Through recognising and thanking them for contributing to the cityscape, the campaign aims to build understanding between different communities in Singapore. Here's how you can take part:
