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The <u>World Federation of the Deaf</u> estimates that there are 72 million deaf people worldwide and according to <u>The Singapore Association For The Deaf</u> (SADeaf), the number of individuals with hearing loss in Singapore is estimated to be <u>around 500,000</u>. SADeaf has more than 5,400 clients who are deaf or hard of hearing and among them, there is a world where hand, body and facial expressions are used to communicate ideas, feelings and sentiments, very similar to how people use spoken and written languages.

Sign language is part of Deaf Culture - a set of social beliefs, behaviours, history, values, and shared institutions of communities that are influenced by deafness. In order to raise awareness of the importance of sign language, the United Nations has designated 23 September as the <u>International Day of Sign Languages</u>. First celebrated in 2018 under the theme "<u>With Sign Language</u>, Everyone Is Included", the theme for 2019 is "Sign Language Rights For All".

Did you know that we have a community within NTU who are not only sign language trained, but also regularly put up <u>song-signing performances</u>? We even have <u>students who have contributed to creating a Sign Bank!</u>
