

<u>Nearly three in 10 persons with disabilities (PWDs) who are of working age are</u> <u>employed</u>. According to the annual Comprehensive Labour Force Survey by the Ministry of Manpower (MOM), the resident employment rate was 28.6% among PWDs in the working ages of 15 to 64.

The government has taken various measures over the past 10 to 15 years to make Singapore more inclusive, including drawing up <u>Enabling Masterplans</u>, encouraging inclusive employment and extending the <u>Compulsory Education</u> <u>Act</u>. Campaigns, such as "<u>See The True Me</u>" by the National Council of Social Service, also seek to not just change attitudes and perception towards persons with disabilities, but to also educate the public on communication tips and support strategies.

Various community events, such as the <u>Purple Parade</u> also serve to celebrate the abilities of persons with special needs. This movement is a unique platform that brings people and agencies with diverse interests, including corporates and education institutions. This year's Parade will take place on 2 November 2019 at Suntec City and our own students will be forming a 130-strong team with the Red Cross Home for the Disabled as part of the Purple Parade Contingent.
