This uncertain outlook has prompted the Government to provide more traineeships, so that job seekers can gain work experience while waiting for a permanent position.

The <u>SGUnited Jobs & Skills Package</u>, unveiled by Deputy Prime Minister Heng Swee Kiat in his <u>Fortitude</u> <u>Budget</u> speech, aims to create 21,000 traineeships this year targeted at young people, up from 8,000 initially announced in the <u>Resilence Budget</u> speech.

The United Nations has designated 15 July as <u>World Youth Skills Day</u>. Rising youth unemployment is one of the most significant problems facing economies and societies in today's world, for developed and developing countries alike. Attaining decent work is a significant challenge, even more so these days.


