PROCESS FOR DEVELOPING RDM POLICY AT SMU

- Built on existing relationship between SMU Libraries and Office of Research & Tech Transfer (ORTT)
- Started working together on Research Data Management (RDM) Policy in 2017
- Studied local and overseas institutional RDM policies
- Studied data policies of journals where SMU faculty tend to publish in

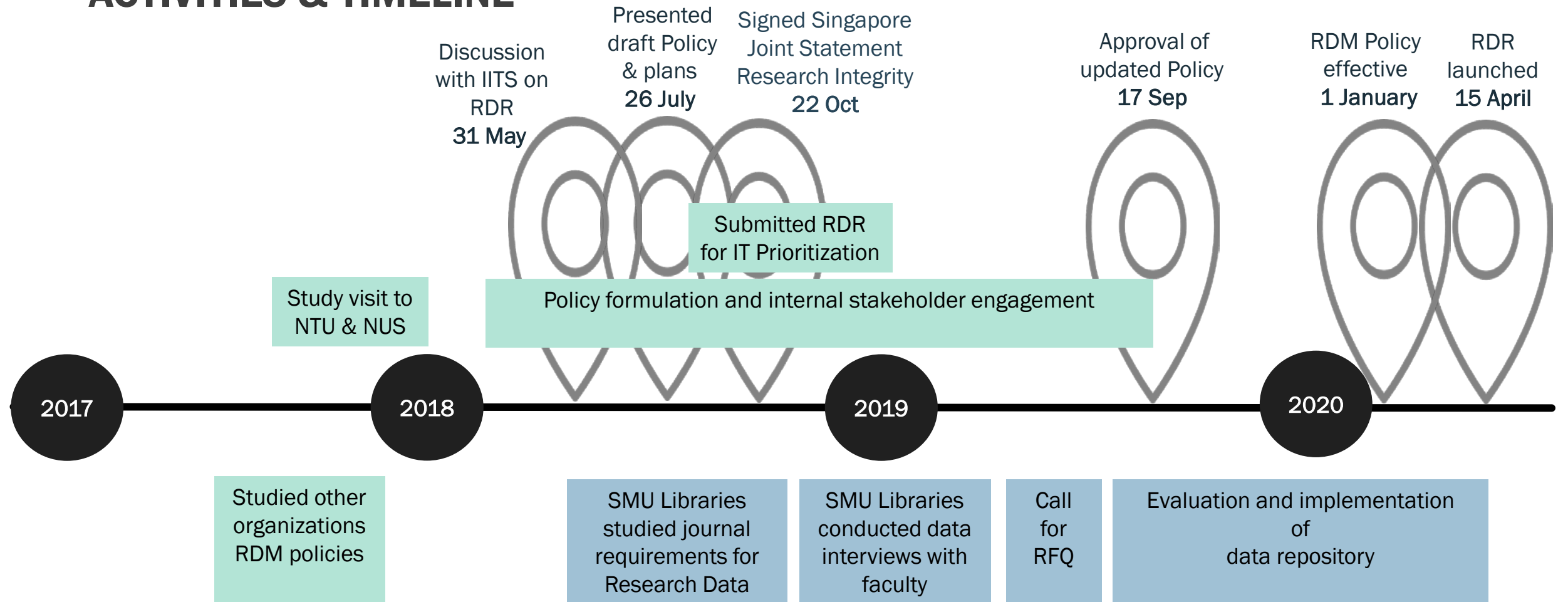
SMU RDM POLICY FINALIZED

- Policy has evolved from the draft version in 2018 to the current version in 2020
- Terminology changed to provide more clarity
- Moved from centralized approach to decentralized approach for data storage and retention
- Data ownership and rights of use aligned with existing Intellectual Property Policy
- Policy effective in Jan 2020

PROCESS TO IMPLEMENT RDR

- Met with IITS to discuss Research Data Repository (RDR)
- Submitted for IT Prioritization and approved
- Call for request for quotation
- Evaluation and implementation of RDR
- Launch of RDR

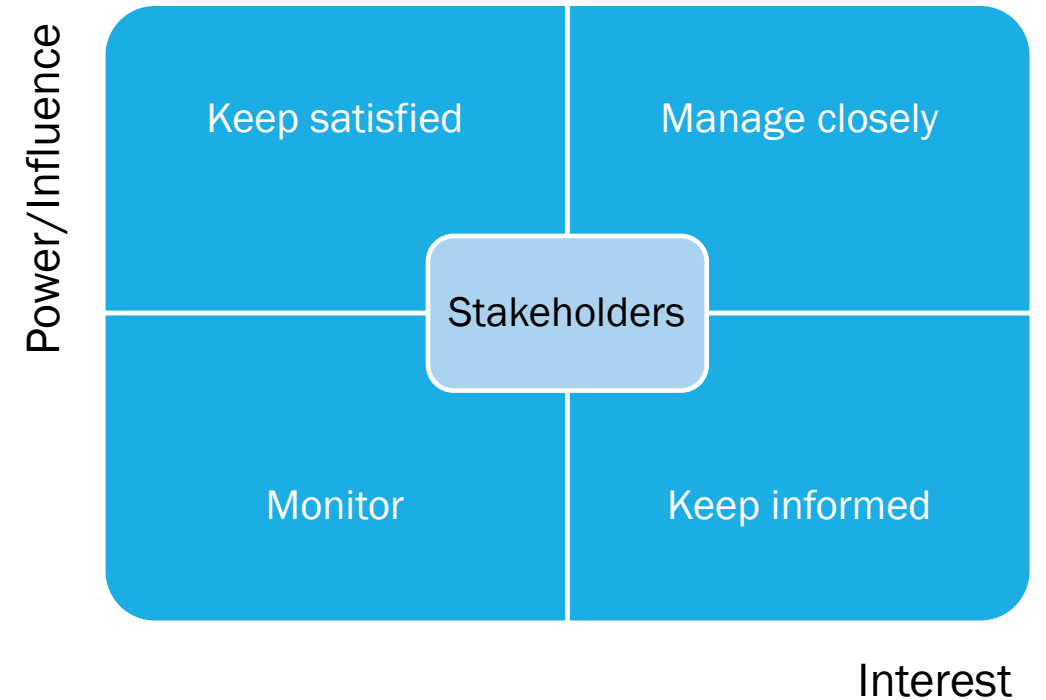

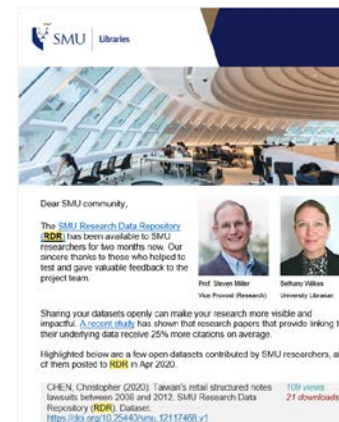


ENGAGEMENT OF SENIOR MANAGEMENT
